Undergraduate bursary

If you are a student SAAFoST member and are going into your second year of study, you can apply for a full-term bursary in the field of Food Science and Technology. The SAAFoST Foundation offers bursaries for full-time undergraduate Food Science and Technology students, awarded on academic merit, employment equity and demonstrated potential.

The bursary covers actual tuition fees levied by the tertiary institution as per a statement of account issued by the institution in the name of the student up to a maximum of R35 000 per annum until graduation.

Part-time bursary for members - BSc Hon & Or B-Tech

SAAFoST paid up full members can apply for bursaries for part-time studies in the field of (BSc Hon) Food Science and (B-Tech) Technology. The bursaries are for part-time Food Science and Technology graduates, awarded on academic merit.

The amount is up to a maximum of R35 000 or pro-rata over the two years for BSc Hon & or B-Tech.
