The Dreosti Award

1981 – Dr Guido Dreosti donated R 1 000 for the establishment of an award for the **Best Research Paper** delivered by a member under 40 years of age, at a SAAFoST Congress.

The Ginsburg Award

Mr Lazar Ginsburg, a founder member of SAFST in 1961, Chairman of the Cape Branch for many years and President of the association from 1965 to 1972, died in June 1989 aged 72. To honour his memory, Council decided to institute the Ginsburg Award worth R 500 for the **Best Poster Presentation** at a biennial congress. First presented in 1991, it was increased to R 5000 in 2007.

In a letter dated 12 December 1989 to Ernest Newbery, Mrs Myrel Ginsburg wrote, “I had only been home a few hours, was feeling the emptiness of my home greatly and maybe even feeling a little sorry for myself! Then I found your letter and read that SAAFoST had decided to honour the memory of *Gins* by instituting a Ginsburg Memorial Award. This tribute to his memory is just the most magnificent gesture possible! Suddenly I was not alone in my memories of *Lossy*, others shared his passing with me. How could I possibly feel “alone” when I had such visible support and strength from so many who knew *Gins*! This was a turning point in my coming to terms with my great loss.”

SAAFoST President's Award

Ernest Newbery Memorial Lecture.

This was instituted to honour the memory Ernest Newbery who was an active and dedicated member of both the Cape and Northern Branches for more than 25 years. He served five terms as Chairman of the Executive Committee of Council, and was Chairman of the organising committee of the first Biennial Congress in Cape Town in 1970.

Meritorius Awards For Journalism

Congress 1991 Journalism Award

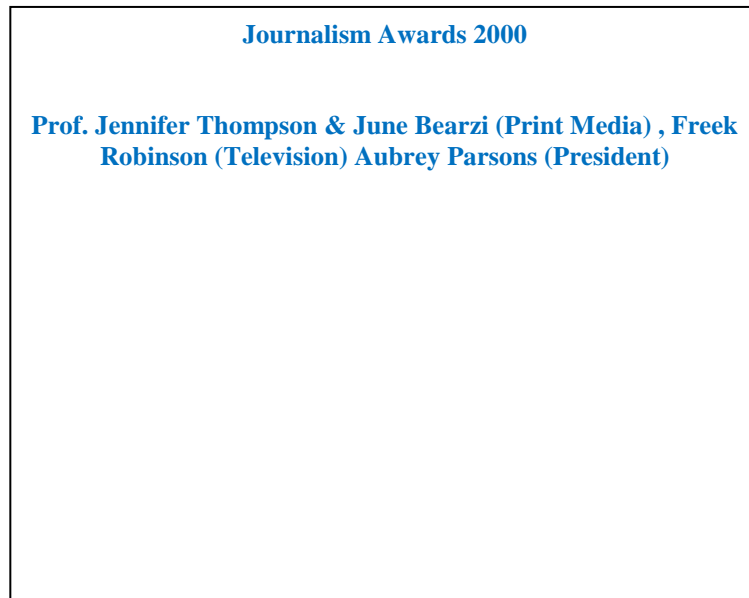
L to R: Debbie Collings, first recipient of the first award for Journalism with President Nick Starke

In the interests of promoting public education on food issues, Ron Timm proposed at the SAAFoST Council meeting on 12 August 1989 the implementation of an Award for Journalism. Subsequently, at the Council meeting on 15 September 1990, it was further proposed that separate awards for both print and electronic media be made. These proposals were adopted unanimously. The awards, consisting of a certificate and a cash prize, for Food Science journalism, are to recognise journalists who adopt a responsible approach and whose reports are objective, scientifically correct and consequently whose work contributes to sound consumer knowledge and understanding of controversial or complex food issues. The award is made annually

for both written and broadcast articles published in South Africa. In 2007 the value of this award was increased to R 5 000 each.

A “finder’s fee” of R 1 000 (2007) is awarded to each of the finders in the “published” and “broadcast” categories.

The article by Mrs Debbie Collings on tartrazine was the first to receive the Meritorious Award for Journalism for 1990, and it was given to her at the SAAFoST Congress Banquet on 20 August 1991.

Distinguished Service Award

Introduced during the Presidency of Nick Starke, this may be awarded to any person for exceptional service to SAAFoST at the discretion of the council. The award takes the form of a framed certificate signed by the President. The award must be motivated in writing by any professional member and seconded by another. The first recipient of this reward was Ms Marzanjah Ackermann (Chairman, Cape Branch). Other recipients have been Mrs. Gill Loubser (Editor *SA Food Review*), Mrs Brenda Neall (Editor *S.A. Food Review*)

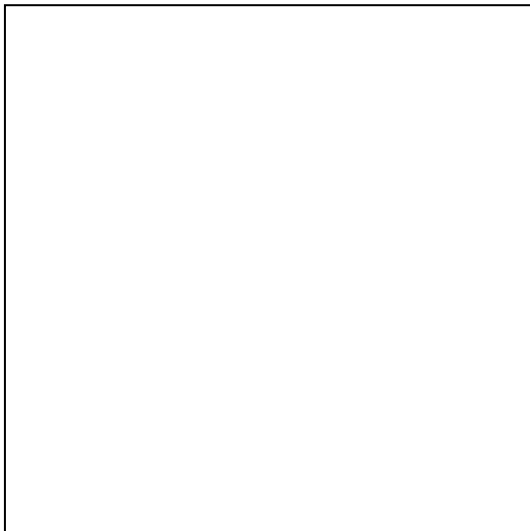

Industrial Achievement Award

It was inaugurated in 1978 and subsequently fell away due to a lack of entries, possibly as a result of very stringent qualifying requirements. It consisted of a shield, a scroll and R500. First awarded in 1979 to Food Corporation, for its Breakfast Cereal, Pronutro Great Start, and then subsequently to Fedfood for Vitamin Enriched Maize Meal.

Bursaries and Scholarships

The Academic Achievement Award was inaugurated in 1978.



Originally it consisted of a shield, a scroll and R250.

In 2010 this award consisted of a certificate and R1 000 prize available to University Food Science and Technology departments for the best final year student, based on academic excellence.

Johan Visser (pictured) won this award while at the University of Stellenbosch in 1982 and

is now a SAAFoST stalwart (Elected Vice President in 2010) and General Manager of Nampak R&D.
